## Our Giving Strategy

The Lundbeck US Charitable Fund provides grants to organizations whose missions align with Lundbeck's purpose to advance brain health who are working to transform lives, and who are accelerating efforts to build a healthy, sustainable society.

#### 1. Accelerate ongoing community efforts

- The Lundbeck US Charitable Fund is a strong and active advocate for organizations in Chicagoland, a large and diverse community with significant areas of need.
- We thoughtfully partner with organizations that are changing lives every day through localized outreach, interventions and support for some of our most atrisk communities, particularly in the areas of mental health care.

#### 2. Address **gaps in care today** through community collaboration

- We actively seek opportunities to support communities that are at high risk of brain disorders, with a goal to make real progress in supporting vulnerable populations or those whose support networks fall behind other communities in resourcing or reach.
- One of our areas of focus is the military and veteran community a population that suffers from a disproportionate burden of mental health disorders. We are amplifying and expanding the reach of incredible organizations in the U.S. who are delivering life-changing impact for our veterans and military families.

#### 3. Fuel truly novel strategies for **future progress**

• We focus on fueling state-of-the-art strategies through innovation acceleration across the community, focusing on those with the potential to redefine the next generation of care for a wide range of brain disorders.

- **Mission:** BUILD supports Chicago's most vulnerable youth: with street violence prevention and intervention, out-of-school activities, summer camps, mental health care, educational support, and much more. They reach 6,500+ young people each year, most of whom fall outside society's safety net.
- **Impact:** Fund supported BUILD's capacity to coordinate care and emergency services. In 2024, BUILD increased the number of youth receiving support services by 55%.

#### **Community Health** | communityhealth.org

- **Mission:** Serve people without essential health care. CommunityHealth is one of the largest volunteer-based health centers in the nation, providing completely free primary and specialty care, medications, lab testing, mental health services, and health education to low-income, uninsured and underinsured adults in Chicago.
- **Impact:** Fund support enabled expansion in the organization's physical space to expand counseling services and health and social resources. In total, Community Health provided nearly 24,000 care appointments in 2023.
- Quality healthcare and disease prevention, health fairs, wellness education, domestic hazard intervention and social support



"When we ask our patients where they would go if they did not have CommunityHealth, 48% report that they wouldn't know where to go, 25% say they would go to the emergency room, and 24% would simply go without care. By serving as a true medical home for our patients, we can impact health disparities throughout Chicago. Lundbeck's support sustains our ability to provide comprehensive health services—not only treatment for pre-existing conditions, but also preventative care, diagnostic testing, and health education to empower patients to take charge of their health." — Laura Starr, Director of External Affairs

#### Stop Soldier Suicide | stopsoldiersuicide.org

- **Mission**: Reduce service member and veteran suicide by using enhanced data insights, focused client acquisition, and suicide-specific intervention services. They pursue an aggressive goal to reduce the military suicide rate by 40% no later than 2030. The ROGER wellness service provides counseling, crisis intervention, and suicide prevention–100% free for U.S. veterans and service members.
- **Impact:** Fund has helped expand support to all 50 states, including personnel and technology resources in the areas that comprise the highest rates of veteran deaths
  - 9,000 hours of support to over 1,000 new clients in 2023, 81% of whom reported feeling better equipped to manage their thoughts and feelings by the time they left care

#### The Headstrong Project |theheadstrongproject.org/

- **Mission**: The Headstrong Project is a non-profit mental health organization providing confidential, barrier-free, and stigma-free PTSD treatment to our veterans, service members, and family connected to their care. Our goal is to help our clients "Triumph Over Trauma." by providing them with effective mental health treatment. Headstrong's network of trauma-informed clinical partners provide individualized, evidence-based outpatient care to our clients.
- **Impact:** Fund resources have allowed the Headstrong Project to scale its mental health care services to meet coverage and care demands now working in 17 states and Washington DC
- The Headstrong Project doubled its service to clients in 2023, reaching more than 2,000 individuals with comprehensive and sustained support; in total the organization completed 39,000 care sessions in 2023 and more than 200,000 sessions since its inception

#### RUSH University Road Home | roadhomeprogram.org/

- **Focus:** The Road Home Program is dedicated to the mental health and wellness of veterans, service members, members of the National Guard, reservists and families at no cost and regardless of discharge status.
- **Impact:** Fund resources supported an inaugural family cohort clinical counseling program uniquely oriented toward current and former military spouses. Feedback was dynamic and positive in the improvement in clinical symptoms, participant satisfaction and staff feedback, and provided clear guidance to continue to improve and expand the program.



**RUSH** 

"A former military spouse sought PTSD treatment from witnessing her veteran husband's suicide; she blamed herself for it. She completed ten sessions (3-4 months' worth of therapy) during one week. By session five, she realized for the first time in four years that she wasn't to blame for her husband's death. By the end of treatment, she reported that she no longer thinks about killing herself." – Case example shared by Dr. Brian Klassen, Clinical Director

- **Focus:** MATTER is a global healthcare startup incubator, community nexus and corporate innovation accelerator headquartered in Chicago. It is mobilizing a community of entrepreneurs, industry innovators, scientists and clinicians committed to improving health and care for every patient.
- **Impact:** Fund resources were directed to support innovative concepts in Alzheimer's and related dementia through an accelerator challenge focused on leveraging data sciences for population-based insights. Start-up teams have since built community connections and ideas for resourcing to advance disruptive and transformational data-based solutions to support the Alzheimer's and related dementia populations.
